Heirlooms and Relics

As we continue to downsize at the Huston house entering 2024, our focus turns to family heirlooms in our care and how to protect their legacy. We have a few family heirlooms, just as I am sure you all do as well. Some, like family jewelry, are small and easy to store and protect. Others not so much.

In 1963, while remodeling their downstairs rooms, my mother and father decided on a "colonial theme". The red, white and blue colors used sound horrible, but it worked with white walls, federal blue chair rail and red window valances with white half window curtains. In keeping with the colonial theme my father built a faux fireplace with flanking book cases. All the woodwork there was white and he used faux brick made of cork (you had to see it to believe it) for the hearth. Braided oval rugs, in various shades of blue, covered the floor. My father had a family friend whose father was a local artist. Dad visited his studio looking for something to hang over the fireplace and found a large painting depicting George and Martha Washington visiting the Continental army at Valley Forge. Since we were ten miles from the then "state park" he decided that this was a perfect fit to complete the room's theme. When my dad passed away and we were selling the house, and since I did not want anything from the house for myself, my brother and sister built a shipping crate, packed up the painting and shipped it to me. The fireplace and painting have been a backdrop for family photos through the years and a pictorial history of sorts as our family grew in size. How could I do anything but keep it.

When Kathy's father immigrated to the United States in 1929, he began a career working for US Steel in the foundry at the bottom of Ohio Street in Moxham. The back breaking work was in an environment of extreme heat and constant danger. He somehow acquired a barber chair with a hydraulic seat and began his true passion on weekends and evenings, providing haircuts for family and friends. Since he did not have a barber's license, he could not charge for the haircuts but people soon began to "tip" him. He kept a cigar box near by and folks started dropping silver dollars in the box. When he passed away in 1976 the family "gifted" the small Moxham house to Kathy and I (we were living in a rental at the time). Since the barber chair was in the basement and weighed several hundred pounds, no one wanted to attempt to remove it so it came "free of charge" with the house. Oh, and we also got all the barber tools too which consisted of razors and scissors. The chair has since been refurbished and moved to Indiana where it resides to this day in our bottom level family room.

Finding a home for these items will be a daunting task for sure. But how can we not. Every time someone looks upon that painting or takes a spin on that barber chair it gives us an opportunity to offer a tale of family history to those present. It is as if my

parents and Kathy's dad are standing right there as we bring to life memories of them.

I suppose that is why the church retains its own heirlooms. Every church has them. You know the things I mean. Items donated or purchased in memory of a loved one. Some pre-date the known history of the church, while others are a more recent remembrance of someone we all knew and now remember whenever we see or use those heirlooms. These are connections to our past church family and provide depth to our church history. When we memorialize someone we are preserving their memory.

And then there are "relics". These are not past possessions of people but "pieces" of canonized men and women who made contributions to the church's growth and history. All cathedrals have relics stored within their walls. For example, the cathedral in Cologne Germany has the bones of the three wisemen. But the most revered "relics" trace back to Jesus himself. The Notre Dame cathedral in Paris is in possession of the "Crown of Thorns" while Turin Italy possesses the burial cloth of Jesus. These relics take on mystical proportions with many of our faithful brothers and sisters. While in the modern era, these relics have come under suspicion as to their authenticity, it does not dissuade true believers from claiming that they provided healing or good luck whenever they viewed or touched them. The bottom line is that Faith plays a major role in the continued veneration of these links to Christ.

I completely understand how people feel about relics. But Jesus gave us the one true way to be in the presence of God, the Eucharist. As Lutherans, we believe that receiving the host and wine puts us in the presence of Jesus as he, through the Holy Spirit is "present" with the elements. I doubt that we think about this enough while receiving communion each week. Like baptism, the Eucharist brings together the material (bread and wine) and the spiritual (the Holy Spirit). Today we provide the Eucharist as the centerpiece of our worship. The words "do this in remembrance of me" tells us that Christ is not only to be remembered but that he is actually present with us in this meal. Perhaps the frequency of the Eucharist in our modern church life has diluted how important this act of faith and remembrance is for us.

Kathy and I have, as Eucharistic Ministers, been taking the Eucharist to the homes of Zion members every month for several years. As Kathy reads the service script saying "we were given assurance of our Lord's PRESENCE by the gift of the Holy Spirit. Now we have brought you this SAME bread from heaven and this cup of blessing, that you may be strengthened and made whole by YOUR participation in the Body of Christ" I see on the faces of those we commune, how special this simple act is for them. Christ's presence is surely there at those moments. It is a moving experience for us and the most important contribution we make to Zion and its membership.

For me heirlooms and relics have their place, but they cannot surpass the Eucharist as the most important gift of remembrance ever given to us. Think about this the next time you approach the altar rail to receive the gifts of bread and wine and remember that Christ is truly with us.

Financial Report October 2023-

YTD income is \$18,225 above budget and at 111% (goal 88.33%). Expenses are running high at 98% of budgeted expenses (goal 88.33%).

O2 accounts ZARP – propose that since ZARP projects are done move the remaining approx. \$600 to Capital Improvement. Also the Back to School Bash account is now zero so can remove that.

As noted on the paper there was a \$480 payment out of Steinway Piano Restoration O2 account. This was in error and should have come from Capital Improvement. Kevin will check with Bev.

Standing Committees-

Administration and Finance- Kevin Huston

2024 Budget- Reviewed the 2024 proposed budget. A few adjustments were made on Ministry Support.

Worship & Music-The IUP Music Scholars amount was added. Also the online service expense.

The Organ repair and maintenance was reduced since it will be newly refurbished. The annual elevator maintenance expense has been greatly reduced since we have contracted with the other company.

Some discussion on Evangelism funds and Building Maintenance Fund (emergency fund).

Seeing that we have a \$21,000 surplus in in 2023 budget, council revised the proposed 2024 budget by adding \$20,000 to **budget income** from that surplus. \$10,000 will be directed to line item **Building Maintenance** fund and \$5,000 each to **Evangelism** new programing, and **Recreation & Fellowship** new programing in the 2024 budget.

Motion made to approve these changes and send to congregational meeting. (Shirley/Rik)- passed.

Dory spoke of an idea to hold a monthly community meal in collaboration with Calvary at Zion. This would be 1 Friday a month 11:30- 1pm using Zion's kitchen. Staffing by Calvary. Some discussion and questions about, our liability, interference with preschool at those times, clean up. No decision.

Building use request for Calvary Staff meeting – Second Friday in Jan 12, 6-8pm building use. \$25.

Environmental Pest Control did our annual inspection. Fire extinguishers have also been inspected.

Furnace room support beams have been repaired, and the Borough has sealed the crack along the curb and Church Street that had allowed water to leak into the furnace room.

Terminex - The bat removal has been completed and bell tower has been sealed to prevent re- entry.

Elevator repair is done, with the elevator inspected and licensed. Operational.

Mold in kitchen storage room – Temporary treatment has been done to remove the mold, (smells better in there) and looking into a company to do sealing on the walls.

- Rec & Fellowship, and Evangelism - \$5,000 was added to each for new programming. To pay for this \$10,000 is going to be taken from our 2023 budget surplus of \$20,000.
- Approved a donation of \$5,000 to Lutherlyn's Capital Campaign. From our Memorial fund.
- Transfer of Thrivent Investments (\$22,570.67), and the Steinway Repair Fund (\$19,002) to the Endowment fund. They will have the same use, but will get a better return. To access this money the church would have to have a congregational meeting and have a 2/3 vote in favor from the congregation. Will move this in January 2024.
