Beginning in January, the Zion Community Food Pantry will move indoors with a streamlined operation. On the 3rd Saturday of each month from 10 AM to Noon, the Church Street glass door will be open for families to enter the church, walk to the social hall, pick up three bags of groceries, and exit via the red Church Street door, without having to wait in line or complete paperwork.
