Zion's Future is in Our Hands (Yes, More of the same!)

Many of you know that I am a huge baseball fan. I have followed the Philadelphia Phillies faithfully since the mid 1960's. In 1980 the Philadelphia Phillies played in the World Series. It was their first appearance in the series in 30 years. It was the first time in my lifetime that this happened. There were some close calls in previous years. As a twelve year old, I closely followed "my team" through the summer of 1964 only to suffer deep disappointment when the team collapsed at the end of the season, losing ten straight games and the pennant to the St. Louis Cardinals. In the mid-seventies, "my guys" won the NL East three times but failed to get past the Cincinnati Reds and the Los Angeles Dodgers. Even 1980 was a struggle as the Houston Astros took my heroes from the city of brotherly love to extra innings in the final game.

I mention all this because in 1980 I was given the chance to actually attend a World Series game. That's right, I was offered a seat at game one of the 1980 World Series. You see my sister was working at the box office of a local theater at the time and her job put her in touch with several area "scalpers". Scalpers earn their living buying tickets to concerts and sporting events and then selling them for a premium when the demand for the seats increases. This is a speculative business and it is often illegal to buy and sell tickets outside the venues where the tickets are to be used. But buying and selling tickets like this is a great way for people like me, who would otherwise never have a chance, to get a ticket to an event like the World Series. I bought two tickets to that game for the unheard of sum of \$50.00 each. It was \$100 dollars that we could not afford at the time, but the cost was outweighed by the desire to get a seat at the greatest event in Phillies baseball history.

I wonder what a scalper would charge for a guaranteed seat in Heaven? It has to be the most sought after ticket of all time. I would imagine we would gladly give up our worldly fortunes for a seat at that venue, or would we? Well, I'm glad we don't have to make that choice. For you see, Christ has already bought the ticket for us. Think about that for a minute. A seat at the greatest venue of them all, free for anyone who accepts the grace of God, given freely through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. We are baptized into Christ. What does that really mean? It means that we are his. A full participant in the body of Christ. We are bestowed eternal life through him. And what does it cost us? Nothing.

In trying to understand that kind of love and sacrifice in human terms, the closest I can get to it is the unconditional love we have as parents and grand-parents. The term "I've got your back" has real meaning for me as a parent and grand-parent. It means that I will always be there to love and support my children and grand-children no matter what. This can be hard for some of us, as the free will we give our children and grand-children allows for a lot of things to happen that truly tests our love for them. We are, at times, really tested but we stay the course because we love them. What else can we do! I imagine that it is the same with God. We test him constantly. We stray from God, we resist Him and the grace He bestows on us, we deny Him and ignore Him, yet He is always there with open arms and a happy heart when we return asking for forgiveness and mercy. It is not always easy to trust God. And it is not always easy to rely on God's grace. We humans want to do—to earn—to pay for that ticket. We don't always trust that God is there in front of us and that God's grace is really, truly free.

Our Zion is important to us because it stands as a daily symbol that God's grace is alive and active in the world. We eagerly reach out to provide love and support to all who wish to receive God's grace with us. That is why it is so important for us to seriously plan a future for our congregation. I hope that we will always be a fixture in this place, constantly proclaiming the grace of God, free to all through the death and resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Through grace, God has our back. Let's leave the ball games and theatre tickets to the scalpers and let God's grace through Jesus Christ be our true path to salvation.

Audit Committee – Becky Slade

Report on 2022 Audit – There is some money coming in that is interest accrued, but it's not known where it is coming from. K. Huston will look into it to get it labeled.

Evangelism /Stewardship – Kim Balcerak- Passed around an Easter cross tag which will be handed out at Easter vigil. Looking into having a trip to a Pittsburgh Pirates game in August or September. If we were to go to Sight & Sound, there would be 36 people needed for a bus. R. Wissinger suggested having another game night and also an outdoor event such as a picnic at Luther Chapel.

Parish Education – Gail Sechrist- The kids are continuing to practice songs for a church service in the future.

Property –K. Huston there was some confusion with unlocking doors. They will be unlocked 30 minutes before service starts, and will lock 30 minutes after the service starts. K. Balcerak suggested locking the doors 15 minutes after the service starts. We decided that we will start with 30 minutes and see how it works. M/ S. Horner 2^{nd} K. Balcerak.

Stained glass window repairs- The window restorers suggested breaking down the project into smaller groups. Start with the windows on the parking lot side. They also suggested turning the windows at street level on the nave into regular windows. They will have an estimate in about a week to us. Parking lot windows are possibly going to be replaced with frosted glass since it's the side of the church that gets the most weather exposure. They will be more energy efficient. The company is able to crate up the existing stained glass and send it to us so we would have them. They estimate the work to take between 8-12 months. Well into 2023 until it's scheduled and completed. This is a big long term project.

Recreation and Fellowship – S. Dickson, S. Horner- There was a funeral dinner for about 70 people who were happy. There were numerous people who helped out including Kevin Huston, Kay Thorell and Sue Dickson.

Social Ministry – Sue Dickson-Food pantry this weekend. **Trinity 3-2-1** - Rik Wissinger- 2/15 meeting firm up times for upcoming services. Spoke about ways we can get more people in the pews. Have pastor make an announcement for the online services that we miss having them in person. May 14th from 4-8pm Luther Chapel is having a Mother's Day tea. An announcement will be made in the bulletin.

Worship and Music – Pastor Tedd- Working on the Easter Vigil. No recording yesterday. Look at recording weddings. One family asked for the possibility of recording the service. It may be feasible to make arrangements with the family for them to record services. K. Huston M/- 2nd S. Dickson- Allocate \$5000 to purchase new equipment for recording services. K. McCullough asked about the possibility of getting a grant to cover the costs. Pr. Tedd said that there was a one-time COVID grant which is no longer available. There is about half of the money that is set aside for the new equipment. Motion passed.

The goal is to encourage people to set up a plan to leave a gift for a congregation or a Lutheran charity that they want to support. Ryan stated that setting up a workshop after service on a Sunday is a possibility if there is an interest. **Inform** let them know that they have possibilities fund for future ministries. **Inspire** Share with them what things have done in the past by previous members. **Invite** Make an ask and let people know that there are different ways to give.

Members are good at donating for specific items, but previously there have been problems from time to time to donate for mundane things. Have a gift policy and encourage people to have a plan for what it's going to be designated for. 50% for a certain thing, 40% for another thing, and 10% for the general fund. Ryan would be able to facilitate an unbiased conversation. A suggestion was made to put a blurb in the newsletter about the ELCA foundation to inform people of other options about giving, other than CD's and savings accounts. Focus on long term sustainability. Figure out a tactful way to recognize people who gave legacy gifts. Maybe a legacy church service, or a legacy dinner. Invite people into conversation with Ryan to encourage giving.

PROPERTY COMMITTEE MINUTES

April 19, 2022

Committee issues discussed:

Completed Projects

- 1. 2/22/2022 Environmental Pest Control performed their monthly service (\$45.00)
- 2. 3/16/2022 Certa Site performed annual service on kitchen ANSUL system (\$339.00)
- 3. 3/29/2022 Environmental Pest Control performed their monthly service (\$45.00)
- **4.** 3/31/2022 TMR has been contracted to perform repairs on the nave and adjoining building roof (\$5,100.00)
- **5.** 3/31/2022 TMR re-caulked the "Jesus" window to seal it for leaks. (\$2,750.00)

On Going Projects:

- 1. TMR will be contacted again for help in solving the persistent leak problem in the nave entrance.
- 2. The committee received a revised bid from Willet Hauser on the repair and replacement of Zion's windows EXCLUDING those in the Nave. These windows would be replaced with frosted glass. The bids were broken down into four sections A. Parking Lot upper and lower \$99.877.00, B. Pre-School Area- \$32,800.00, C and D Lower nave windows on North and South side, stairwell windows, upper floor windows on South side \$54,185.00 for a combined total cost of \$186,862.00. If all four zones are done at the same time the cost would be \$154,091.00. This would be a \$32,771 savings for the congregation.
- **3.** DOBIL submitted a revised bid for upgrading Zion's On-Line church service offering. The revised bid was \$4,250. The bid was approved and the equipment was ordered. DOBIL engineers did a site visit on 3/24/2022 to review placement and installation of the projects equipment and all equipment was ordered. We are currently waiting for the equipment to arrive to begin installation.
- **4.** The Committee received a bid for painting the five red exterior doors and railing from Lukehart Home Specialists at a cost of \$1,850.00. The committee voted to recommend to council that this project be approved.

Other 2022 Projects

- 1. The committee will be seeking bids for renovation work for the kitchen in the spring of 2022.
- 2. The ceiling tiles in the narthex will be replaced once the water leak is deemed to be permanently repaired.
- 3. The committee is researching for a vendor to address our ongoing bat infestation problem.
- 4. The committee will be asking for bids to replace the roof on the nave. (This follows a recommendation from TMR that this may need to be addressed within the next two years.)
